1992 St. Patricks Day Parade Cover

The 10th Annual St. Patrick's Day Parade in Syracuse, NY was held on March 14, 1992. Syracuse's St. Patrick's Day Parade dates back to the 1850's, when the procession consisted of Irish men parading their pride for their homeland. For at least 50 years, there was no parade in Syracuse. But in 1983 the tradition was revived. Since then the parade has grown in size, quality and popularity.

The Syracuse Stamp Club, in conjunction with the St. Patrick's Day Parade Committee and the Syracuse Post Office, celebrated the event with a special pictorial, commemorative cancel and cacheted cover. The covers bear the following U.S. stamps: actor John McCormack, filmmaker D. W. Griffith, architect James Hoban and entertainer George M. Cohan. All four men are of Irish heritage. The traffic light shown is known as the only one in the country in which the green light is on top and is located on Tipperary Hill in Syracuse, NY. This traffic light was featured on the cover celebrating the 1991 St. Patrick's Day Parade.

SYRAPEX '93 COVER


The Syracuse Stamp Club hosted SYRAPEX '93 on October 23rd & 24th. 1993, in Syracuse, New York.


The Show featured a 25 dealer bourse, frames of exhibits, a super youth booth, and a United States Postal Service station.





ONONDAGA COUNTY BICENTENNIAL COVER

The year 1994 marks the official Bicentennial of Onondaga County. The fascinating history of this area, however, began long before the first European settlers arrived, when members of the Onondaga Nation of the Iroquois Confederacy fished its waters, tilled its soil, and hunted its abundant wildlife. The County was named for these Onondaga, or "people of the hill." By the 1700's settlers began arriving in ever greater numbers and on March 5, 1794 the New York Legislature created the County of Onondaga and the four towns-Lysander, Manlius, Marcellus and Pompey-that comprised it.

The five graphics on the cover represent different aspects of Onondaga County history. The turtle is a symbol of the Iroquois people, the packet boat represents the canal years, the basket of apples and the barn remind us of the farms that have long been a part of the landscape and the automobile symbolizes the Franklin Auto and the industries that made Onondaga County famous.

The Syracuse Stamp Club, in conjunction with Onondaga County Parks and the United States Postal Service, celebrated the event with a special cancel and cacheted cover.

Among the major additions to the zoo are many outdoor exhibits showcasing animals in their natural habitats, a rainforest exhibit, and habitats for many endangered species. Especially exciting, the zoo is currently building an exhibit for Humboldt Penguins, who are sure to be a big crowd-pleaser.






SEMPER FI STATION **NOVEMBER 10, 2005, SYRACUSE, NEW YORK**



SYRAPEX 2007 HONORING LOUIS C. TIFFANY

This special event cover honoring Louis C. Tiffany (1819-1912) is made in the form and gives the feel of a miniature stained glass window. In fact, you can see through it to the inside of the envelope. This particular window is a copy of one Tiffany did in 1924. Tiffany and his studio were not only famous for his stained glass windows but also for jewelry, lamps, vases and a number of other glass items. Syracuse and Central New York have several examples of his work including a full 1903 window in the Everson Museum in Syracuse and windows in Auburn's Willard Memorial Chapel.

For a number of years Syracuse was home to an apprentice of Louis C. Tiffany, Henry Keck whose stained glass studio was in operation from 1913 to 1974.

The cover and cancels were designed by Vincent Juchimek, a Syracuse Stamp Club member. The cachet is adapted from a Tiffany design pictured in the book, <u>Tiffany Designs Stained Glass Coloring Book</u> Rendered for Coloring by A.G. Smith, Dover Publications, Inc., c1991. Special thanks to Dover Publications for granting permission to use this image as well at to the members of the Syracuse Stamp Club for their support.

Note: Due to the material of the cachet, this cover should be kept away from extreme heat, cold, and strong light.


RECOGNIZING FOUR FAMOUS AMERICAN SCIENTISTS

This first day issue cover honors four American Scientists:


- 1. Physicist John Bardeen was the inventor of the transistor and is the only person to have won two Nobel Prizes in Physics.
- 2. **Biochemist Gerty Theresa Cori** (nee Radnitz) was a winner of the Nobel Prize in Physiology/Medicine for her work studying glycogen and carbohydrate metabolism.
- 3. **Astronomer Edwin Powell Hubble** discovered the Andromeda Galaxy and galaxies beyond our own Milky Way. This discovery changed the view of the universe in the early 20th Century. The telescope now in orbit is named for him.
- 4. Chemist Linus Carl Pauling was one of a few people to win two Nobel Prizes in two different fields. His first, for Chemistry, was for his research into the nature of the chemical bond, which helped lead other scientists to discover the double helix structure of the DNA molecule. In 1962, he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for his campaigning against above-ground nuclear testing.

The cover design and special cancel were created by Vincent Juchimek, a member of the Syracuse Stamp Club. The U.S. Postal Service unveiled the stamps honoring the four American scientists on March 6, 2008 at the Milton J. Rubenstein Museum of Science & Technology (MOST) in Syracuse, NY.






SYRAPEX 2011 REMEMBERS SYRACUSE CHINA

The Onondaga Pottery Company (O.P. Co.) began in 1871, later changing its name to Syracuse China. Initially, it produced earthenware and expanded later into producing fine china for hotels, restaurants, airlines, railroads, and housewares. The manufacturing facility in Syracuse closed in 2009 after 138 years in operation. Production was moved out of North America.


The cachet design of Syracuse China on the SYRAPEX cover and the two special cancels were created by Vincent Juchimek, a member of the Syracuse Stamp Club. The inspiration for these was from the book, Syracuse China by Cleota Reed and Stan Skoczen, published in 1977 by the Syracuse University Press and from the Onondaga Historical Association which inherited the archives and extensive china collections. The OHA has a portion of this collection beautifully displayed and will change items occasionally to keep the exhibit fresh. The "Poppy" plate on the front of the envelope was designed by Harry Aitken, an English designer hired by Syracuse China in 1904. The other plate is a general dinnerware pattern designed for commercial hotels. Every cover purchased will have a card enclosed giving the bearer an honorary membership in the Turn-Over Club.
